

**Exercise 1** Identifying Adjective Phrases. Each of the following sentences contains at least one prepositional phrase used as an adjective. Underline each adjective phrase and draw an arrow pointing from it to the word it modifies.

**EXAMPLE:** The room in the back is very damp.

1. Mr. Suarez bought a new car with a sun roof.
2. The book about Eleanor Roosevelt is inspiring.
3. Mary is the supervisor of all the nurses.
4. The house near the top of the hill has been sold.
5. The tree in the corner of the yard is a weeping cherry.
6. This is the way to the shopping mall.
7. The autographed picture of Reggie Jackson is one of my treasures.
8. The carton of eggs at the bottom of the bag has been crushed.
9. The captain of the precinct gave a talk about gun control.
10. The front steps of many houses in Baltimore are white marble.

**Exercise 2** Identifying Adverb Phrases. Each sentence contains at least one prepositional phrase used as an adverb. Underline each adverb phrase and draw an arrow pointing from it to the word it modifies.

**EXAMPLE:** With increasing excitement she read the last chapter.

1. Our scout troop hiked through the forest.
2. At the traffic light, the road curves to the left.
3. They arrived early in the day.
4. Susan is upset about her science grades.
5. At the zoo many kinds of animals live in harmony.
