(a) What is a hurricane?

Ans: A hurricane is a powerful swirling storm found in tropical parts of the Atlantic Ocean (called tropical cyclones in Asia or typhoons in Oceania).

(b) Define harbour.

Ans: A harbour is a place where ships and boats can shelter or unload.

(c) How do hurricanes form?

Hurricanes form when the air is much warmer than the surface of the ocean. The winds then pick up huge amounts of energy and water vapour as they rush towards the land. When the wind speed reaches 120 kph the storm is called a hurricane.
